- Mayor Chamberlain wants to move Jay Wohlschlaeger for Park Discussion before the Police Report.
- Mayor Chamberlain wants to strike the closed session.

Motion to approve the agenda with the two changes was made by Alderman Bonzo, seconded by Alderman Elwood. Motion passed with no dissentions.

Approval of the Minutes from the Board Meeting on June 25, 2019

Motion to approve the minutes from the board meeting on June 25, 2019 was made by Alderman Bonzo, seconded by Alderman Elwood. Motion passed with no dissentions.

New Business

- Jay Wohlschlaeger from SWT Design gave a presentation on the park. We are working on a master plan for the park. This is the 1st of two public meetings. We have a solid foundation and will build on that. What are the amenities that the community would like to improve the park? After tonight we will consolidate the two ideas into one and get some costs for the project. The second meeting, we will be tweaking the plan. What would you like to see happen first with the initial phase for improvement to the park? The park is approximate 2 acres. The north side is where the existing amenities are now. The creek splits the park and the south side is an open field. Is there a need for more parking? What can be done to visually improve the creek? We want to focus on how we

can build on what is in the park now. How can we add a trail, and we will need to address the ADA accessibility. Parking on the upper park would be parking spots by Walton road. Can we run the trail through the creek? Adding a pavilion to the south side, we would need to decide what materials to use. We have two options for the trail, should it be concrete or asphalt? The overlook shelter, do you want timber framed or steel, wrapped in stone. Playground replacement with surfacing, poured in place or synthetic. Adventure play or nature play? Take home the pictures of the park and the next discussion will be at the next meeting on August 13th.

Police Report

- Police Chief Aaron Jimenez gave the police report.
- In St. Ann, we had a lot of firework complaints. The size of the fireworks is bigger now.
- The Victims Advocate will be coming to the next meeting.
- The Police Board Commission needs 3 or 5, one at large. This needs to be placed on the agenda to pass an ordinance for the commission.
- Officer Sontheimer was in an accident while pulling out of St. Ann, he had a few bumps and bruises and was cleared by the Workman's Comp doctor.
- The person responsible for Angie Houseman's murder has been transferred here and his arraignment will be in the next 30 days.
- Next month we will have the Calea report.
- Thanks to Frank and Doris who hosted a barbeque at St. Ann to benefit Officer Michael Langsdorf's family.
- The resident next to John's Butcher Shoppe was reported missing and his door was left open. After investigating this, we learned that he was in rehab with knee surgery. The person that was coming by with his mail, left the door open.
- Neighborhood watch is the last Thursday of the month at St. Ann.
- St. Ann & Overland covered for Vinita Park so their staff could attend the funeral of Officer Langsdorf. What an awesome job.

City Hall Report

- The City Hall Reports were presented by City Administrator, Mike Pauley.
- The financial reports are included with the packet. We met two weeks ago and haven't spent anything with the new budget.
- Our account Heidi will be at the August.

New Business

- Appointment for the Board President was presented by Mayor Chamberlain. Alderman Klema nominated Tom Bonzo for Board President. Alderman Bonzo accepted the appointment.

Motion to appoint Tom Bonzo as Board President was made by Alderman Klema, seconded by Alderman Elwood. Motion passed with no dissensions.

- Appointment for the Treasurer was presented by Mayor Chamberlain. Alderman Bonzo nominated Bob Terry. Alderman Terry accepted the appointment.

Motion to appoint Bob Terry as Treasurer was made by Alderman Bonzo, seconded by Alderman Klema. Motion passed with no dissensions.

- Appointment for Police Board Commission – we need an ordinance. Mayor Chamberlain nominates Robin Metz to the Police Board Commission in Ward 2.

Motion to approve the nomination for Robin Metz to the Police Board Commission for Ward 2 was made by Alderman Bonzo, seconded by Alderman Elwood. Motion passed with no dissensions.

- RFP for Milling and Repaving Marshall Road from Forest to Argyle was presented by Mike Pauley, City Administrator. We have budgeted \$60,000 for street repairs. We need to get this done while school is out. We will be going out for bid for this project.
- RPF for Bristow repaving was presented by the City Administrator. We will spot milling on Bristow in house. We will go out for bid for this project.
- Tearing down the RDA building was presented by the City Administrator. The board was asked if they have a problem with doing the demolition in-house. The board approved in-house demolition with the use of a contractor for assistance. We are waiting on Spire to disconnect the gas before this can be done. We are also waiting on the quiet title. This will probably take about 2 months.

Comments from the Aldermen

Ward 1

- Alderman Bonzo stated the 3rd phase of Lackland shoulders was finished. This project encompassed both Ward 1 and Ward 2. Hopefully next year, we will have the other side done.
- Alderman Terry stated that Peter & Mike have been replacing sidewalks by the middle school. Peter & Mike also cleaned up the corner behind John's Butcher Shoppee that was overgrown by vines and weeds. We received a donation of books for the library by the community garden by the Presbyterian church.

Ward 2

- Alderman Elwood stated the east side of Lackland looks very good. Alderman Elwood complimented Peter and Mike for taking the milling that was going to be thrown away and use it as surface material at public works. The block party on Argyle was a great party.
- Alderman Klema thanked Mr. Wohlschlaeger for coming to the meeting and giving us options for the park. Alderman Klema is glad that the project has started.

Mayor's Report

- The mayor was sorry for not being here last week but had a health emergency.
- The shoulders on Lackland look good.

City Administrator's Report

- Mike and Peter have been working around the school, tearing out and replacing bad sidewalks. They are doing this now while the school is out for the summer.

City Attorney's Report

- We have one ordinance for Conflict of Interest that we must adopt every 2 years.
- The City Attorney gave an update on Show Me Courts.

Ordinance No. 19-8

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 200 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF CHARLACK, MISSOURI AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN TO ESTABLISH A BOARD OF POLICE COMMISSIONERS.

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen ("Board") of the City of Charlack, Missouri ("City") would like to improve accountability for police activity to the citizens of the City; and

WHEREAS, the Board believes that it will advance the public health, safety and welfare to establish a Board of Police Commissioners; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF CHARLACK, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section One. Chapter 200 of the Municipal Code of the City of Charlack is hereby amended by the addition of a new Article VII entitled "Board of Police Commissioners," to read as follows:

Title II: **Public Health, Safety, and Welfare**

Chapter 200: **Police Department**

Article VII: **Board of Police Commissioners**

Section 200.110: **Established**

The Board of Police Commissioners of the City of Charlack is hereby created and established.

Section 200.120: **Membership - Qualifications, Terms, Compensation**

- A. The Board of Police Commissioners shall consist of five (5) members, all of whom shall be residents of the City and who shall have been residents of the City for one (1) whole year next preceding their appointment. Two (2) Commissioners shall be selected from each City ward and one (1) Commissioner shall be selected at large.
- B. No person shall serve as a member of the Board of Police Commissioners who shall not have obtained the age of twenty-one (21) years prior to the date of his/her appointment. No person shall serve on such Board if he/she

is in arrears on any taxes owed to the City, or is not qualified to vote in the City municipal elections, or has been or is ever convicted of a felony.

- C. All appointments shall be for a period of two (2) years, and any member of the Board shall be eligible for reappointment.
- D. The term of the Chairman, who shall be appointed by the Mayor of the City, shall be for a period of one (1) year, and he/she shall be eligible for reappointment; provided however, that should he/she for any reason cease to be a resident of the City during his/her term as Chairman of the Board of Police Commissioners he/she shall cease to hold such office, and the balance of the term for which he/she has been appointed shall be served by a duly appointed member of the Board of Police Commissioners.

Section 200.130: Appointment – Removal

- A. All appointments to the Board of Police Commissioners shall be made by the Mayor with the approval of the majority of the Board of Aldermen.
- B. Members may be removed in the same manner and form prescribed by Statutes for the removal of other appointed officers in Cities of the same class.

Section 200.140: Powers and Duties

- A. The Board members shall not have the power, nor shall they assert the power, to exercise direct supervision over any member of the Police Department and the performance of his/her police duties, but shall contact the Marshal in all matters requiring supervision or the giving of orders.
- B. The Board shall have the power as a body to investigate any allegations or complaint regarding any action or actions of any Police Officers serving the City, and shall promptly report the results of that investigation, after a hearing, to the Mayor and Marshal of the City in writing. The report shall set forth the action complained of, the results of the investigation conducted, together with the Board's recommendation as to what action should be taken by the Board of Aldermen and the Marshal, and shall state the vote of the Board upon the action recommended.
- C. The Board of Police Commissioners shall not usurp or exercise any of the powers of the Marshal over the members of the Police Department directly, but shall meet with the Marshal as a body, and advise him/her of any matter it believes requires attention or remedy. Disagreements or differences of opinion between the Board

of Police Commissioners and the Marshal shall be referred to the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen for determination.

- D. The Board of Police Commissioners shall review the ordinances of the City governing the Police Department, and shall become familiar with the Statutes of the State regarding Police Officers in the Cities of the same class as the City of Charlack, and shall recommend such legislation by the City as may be deemed necessary and/or desirable in its interest for providing the most efficient police protection available for the City.
- E. The Board of Police Commissioners shall call upon the City Attorney of the City for such legal advice or services as may be required in the performance of its duties.

Section 200.150: Meetings – Rules of Procedure

- A. Meetings of the Board of Police Commissioners shall be held at the call of the Chairman, or on order of the Mayor, or upon written notice to all the members of the Board stating the purpose of the meeting. In case of emergency, the written notice shall not be necessary if waived by four (4) members other than the Chairman, and further provided that the remaining members are orally advised or it is not reasonably possible to locate them, and further provided that a legal quorum of the Board attends such meeting.
- B. Three (3) members shall constitute a legal quorum of the Board.
- C. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings except that in his/her absence the remaining members of the Board, if there is a legal quorum present, shall appoint an Acting Chairman to serve at such meeting, and he/she shall have all of the powers of the regular Chairman except that he/she shall be permitted to vote on all matters.
- D. The Board shall elect a Secretary from its own membership. The Secretary shall keep accurate minutes of all proceedings of the Board. Upon approval by the Board the minutes shall be signed by the Chairman and attested to by the Secretary.
- E. The agenda of all meetings shall be prescribed by the Chairman or Acting Chairman who shall allow sufficient time for representatives of the public, the Police Department, or any other group, to appear before it.
- F. All meetings shall be held in the City Hall, unless otherwise authorized by the Mayor.

Section 200.160:

Conduct of Investigations and Hearings.

- A. In any investigation regarding the conduct of Police Officers, the officers involved shall be present, and have the right to be represented by counsel, and have the privilege of cross examination of all witnesses and, if he/she chooses, to introduce testimony on his/her own behalf.
- B. The hearing shall be before the whole Board of Police Commissioners and the Marshal shall be present during such investigation and hearing.
- C. At such hearing the Chairman shall regulate the proceedings and take all measures necessary or proper for the efficient performance of such duties.
- D. Any evidence which would be admissible under the general Statutes of the State or under the rules of evidence governing proceedings in matters not involving a trial by jury in the courts of the State shall be admissible in a hearing before the Board of Police Commissioners. The rules of evidence shall be applied in any proceeding to the end, that equal and proper evidence shall be conveniently and expediently produced while preserving the substantial rights of the parties.
- E. The Board shall have the power, in cases involving moral turpitude, to suspend the accused from serving within the City if a majority of the Board determines that the accused is guilty, and further provided that in its report it specifically recommends dismissal of the officer by the Board of Aldermen.
- F. If the Board of Aldermen does not accept the recommendation of the Board of Police Commissioners the suspension from serving within the City shall be immediately lifted, and the officer reinstated.

Section Four. The portions of this Ordinance shall be severable. In the event that any portion of this Ordinance is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the remaining portions of this Ordinance are valid, unless the court finds the valid portions of this Ordinance are so essential and inseparably connected with and dependent upon the void portion that it cannot be presumed that the Board of Aldermen would have enacted the valid portions within the invalid ones, or unless the court finds that the valid portions standing alone are incomplete and are incapable of being executed in accordance with the legislative intent. Nothing herein shall be deemed to regulate or prohibit any activity to the extent that municipal authority is preempted by state or federal law.

Section Five. The Chapter, Article, Division and/or Section assignments designated in this Ordinance may be revised and altered in the process of recodifying or servicing the City's Code of Ordinances upon supplementation of such code if, in the discretion of the editor, an alternative designation would be more reasonable. In adjusting such designations the editor may also change other designations and numerical assignment of code sections to accommodate such changes.

Section Six. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
